The Sewing Circle is going from strength to strength and we now have another 3 overlockers which have been serviced for use on Sewing Circle Days. Currently we have 3 sewing machines and 5 overlockers with a few more being serviced in the weeks ahead. The ladies have lots to keep them busy and there are now two designated bays of storage for machines, fabrics and everything needed. This is a friendly group with lots of expertise available for everyone, and everyone is welcome.

Sewing for Sri Lanka - New Mumma and Joey Packs
See the kangaroo and joey graphic - that is part of our
new label for this important pack. In Sri Lanka the Mums
deliver their babies, wrap them in something and bundle
home. We know that infant mortality is high and
infection rate in the mother is a concern. So we are
putting together these new packs for Sri Lanka through a designated sewing day every month. The
sewing is easy and everyone is welcome - kids too!!

Each pack contains packs for the mumma and the baby (joey)

For the New Mumma

Days for Girls Kit, toiletry kit and two bras

For the Joey

Cot sheet, 4 nappies (and pins), a throw, facewasher and soap, clothing and little toy

Lastly we thank all the knitters from several of the knitting groups across Canberra (and beyond). Currently the fish and chip baby knitting, while so appreciated, is taking a lot of money to freight overseas and so we ask that you help us to send them to the kids in need overseas. Currently we are managing over 100 of these sets as donations every week.

Each jumper set costs about \$1 to send so we ask that if you donate fish and chip baby jumpers – that you help us to send them to the baby's overseas– we just do not have the funds in our coffers to add these to the freight we already send – so please consider a donation with your jumpers.... we want to keep accepting them, but helping us with freight costs is the only way we can get them to where they are so desperately needed.

Pakistan News

The weather in Pakistan has been extremely wet in their unprecedented rainy season with flooding and it has been difficult to get distributions out to the women and girls. But, as rains clearerd both Lubna and Sara took advantage of finer days to distribute in their communities.

This week we are sending boxes of kits to Pakistan with assistance from the Canberra City DFG Team and we have lots of knitted jumpers and winter items to send as well - this is for the start of winter and as the shipments take 9 weeks from Australia and the clothing will reach Pakistan at the beginning of their winter season.

Children are keen to learn and pencils, pens and notebooks are very much appreciated. These are highly valued and essential for learning.

Sadly Lubna had a difficult experience lately when some opportunistic thieves broke into her house, stealing some of the contents of the room where she keeps donations. While the family was unharmed, she is very sad that items were lost that could help the children and the women. It caused a lot of distress, but I have assured Lubna that we would continue to send supplies.

We have been contacted by another woman in Pakistan but sadly at the moment we don't have the funds to support her work. I will keep it in mind but our funds are a bit critical at present and we are focusing on what we have in place at present.

I would like to thank Pak Express Freight - Ahmer and Adsar, who support us so well in getting our kits overseas. I hear stories often about abandoned kits in ports and people not understanding the intricacies of freighting to Pakistan - I particularly am grateful for a seamless service that they offer us.

- Toys & balls clean
- Winter weight clothing including knitted items
- Toothbrush and paste
- Toiletry items
- Stationery and pencils for school
- Kids underwear all sizes
- Hats and beanies all sizes

Sri Lanka News

Since the last update, 280 DfG kits and knitted baby clothes were shipped to Thilini Upananda our Women's Health Ambassador at ChildFund SL. Portland VIC Days for Girls Team very kindly donated these kits to us. My special thanks to Dianne Burch and the team in Portland who not only donated the DfG kits and knitted baby clothes but also paid the applicable freight cost for these to be sent to Sri Lanka. Included in this consignment were 80 knitted baby sets, 70 beanies, 12 children's jumpers and 9 blankets.

In June, another 60 knitted baby sets, 10 children's beanies, 10 knitted teddy bears and 2 blankets were also sent to the Central Province of SL. A big Thank You to our wonderful knitters in Canberra who knitted and donated these items! These baby items will keep new born babies and infants warm and protected from the chill winds and cold nights of the central province of Sri Lanka.

The end of August is the expected date of arrival in Sri Lanka for these two shipments.

During July, ChildFund SL in collaboration with their local implementation partner T-Field Child Development Federation (T-Filed) commenced the delivery and distributions of DfG kits and health education in Nuwaraeliya District – Central Province. T-Field provides Health, Nutrition, Education and Vocational Training programs to uplift living standards of children in tea plantations in Nuwaraeliya District. During the month of July, 298 DfG kits were distributed to disadvantaged school-aged girls from multiethnic backgrounds living in five tea plantation estates in Nuwaraeliya area.







Sri Lanka News (Cont)

DfG Kit distributions and the delivery of health education was carried out by our newest Women's Health Ambassadors Philomina and Thivyayini of T-Field. As mentioned in previous updates, these DfG kits are part of the donation made in 2021 by Lismore and Iluka DfG teams.

In August another 73 DfG kits previously donated by Cairns DfG team were distributed by Philomina and Thivyayini to girls living in two tea plantation estates in the same region. On behalf of all the recipients in Sri Lanka I would like to thank Lismore, Iluka and Cairns teams for your marvellous generosity and support. My special thanks to Thilini Upananda for facilitating the distributions in Nuwaraeliya region through T-Field!

On another note, we are planning and preparing to put together a pack of a few essential items for new mothers and their newborn babies in disadvantaged communities as a trial project. As part of my early planning, I have established contact with Amalika – a very enthusiastic and committed schoolteacher in a remote part of Sri Lanka. Amalika will coordinate the distribution of our New Mumma & Joey packs once we begin to rollout our trial project. Amalika will do this in collaboration with midwifes attached to Public Health Offices in the region. Please watch out for more information in future updates as we progress with the expected rollout of the pilot project later this year.

What's been happening in the Philippines...

We are very happy to be back to normal in that there's currently a steady and regular stream of boxes leaving Australia and arriving in the Philippines, fingers crossed for non more hold ups and shipping delays.

Our incredible team on the ground have made up for lost time and in the past month have distributed kits and other essentials to eight new locations.

We are also thrilledto be working with the amazing people from Roundabout, and I want to give a special shout out and huge thank you to Jodie from the team, whohas been giving us mountains of baby clothes and essentials to send to the Philippines. This has allowed us to send double the number of boxes we have previously to both our dumpsite and orphanage locations.

Another thanks goes out to NextMediamagazines in Sydney who provided us with many boxes of toys and children's magazines. The kids were over the moon to receive these items. As always we are so grateful to all who help us in so many ways, from making and assembling kits, to donations, it truly takes a small army to make it all happen. Thank you!

Zambia News

I often say that Sew for Change all started with a box of fabric... likewise in Zambia - it started with a box of fish and chip baby jumper sets!!!!

Through facebook I contacted the page Knitting Jumpers for African Babies on facebook, run by Marion. I decided to spend some funds (at \$27.50 a kilo) and send a box to Nawa in Lusaka Africa. It was a pleasure to help the babies and new mothers with this essential clothing. This was the first of 5 boxes -thank you to all who helped with the funds to get these to where they are needed.

We have sent bras and underwear for the new mothers and village women, plus small knitted toys. As Nawa said 'there is great jubilation among the women.' When you don't have a bra, or a pair of underwear it is so difficult.

Now we are on to looking at DFG kits for the girls and women. Nawa has opened up the first one we sent her and in Nawas own words,

'Carol how are you? These (kits) are too good to be believed. I get amazed by what you do."

Once we have a pathway to get a better freight option, I think that the girls and women will have their lives changed with the DFG Kits. If anyone has any contacts for freight to Zambia I would love to chat.

Also there is a huge need in Zambia for young mothers to have support to go back to education. If a young girl does not have access to education, her future is very bleak, and pretty much all that lies ahead is a life of servitude or exploitation, or early marriage and too many children. If you want to assist please contact me - there are always ways we can assist - a pair of shoes for school, supplies for babies such as formula, or school fees.
