# Our Future Direction

Canberra Circle of Women will increase our reach within the Canberra Community.

As you might be aware, COVID stopped some important things last year - and one of them was the launch of Canberra Circle of Women. We have, for some time, been considering forming an organisation which oversees our work and becomes a charitable entity in its own right. This will allow us to be more flexible in using the charitable money we raise to further the work overseas - in areas we may not be able to do now - for instance offer a scholarship to a student, or assist with buying something to help women become more independent or financially able to support their families. We believe the time is right for Canberra women to get even more involved globally.





Sew for a Girl Canberra will be part of that change - and we will begin to rebrand in 2022 to Sew for Change - incorporating our branding which we have been using on our clothing for some time.... this is more in line with what we do now and will more easily reflect all we do - incorporating the Days for Girls Kits, sewing and packing activities, markets and more!

## **Pakistan News**

We have certainly completed a number of huge deliveries to Pakistan over the past months, and even through COVID restrictions, whilst we could not meet the demand through lockdown, other teams provided an enormous amount of kits to help supplement our shipments, not only to Pakistan but also to Sri Lanka and the Philippines.

We now have two Ambassadors for Women's Health in Pakistan - Lubna Ghani in Toba Tek Singh - Punjab, and Sara Asif in Taxila. I am so grateful for their work with the girls and women there and it is through their tireless support that we are able to reach so many in the villages, towns and rural centres.

Currently Pakistan is in Winter and we have been supplying winter knitted clothing, blankets and babies clothing to make the winter just a little easier. In particular we are grateful to the CWA and our knitters all over the ACT and NSW for their amazing work.

In Pakistan the girls and women need bras and we thank everyone for giving us your pre-loved bras - this makes such a difference to the dignity of women world-wide, but when the choice is between buying food to feed the family and a bra for the woman - of course the family comes first. So we are grateful for your assistance in this important part of our distributions.







## **Pakistan News**

In Pakistan the need for hygiene to save lives is critical and teaching the children these skills has been incredibly important to the health of kids nad to reduce disease. Donations of toiletry items and in particular tooth brushes and paste has gone a long way in teaching kids that simple things like washing hands and brushing teeth are essential for their health and well being.

In addition the stationery supplies for schools are vital to assist kids who do not have the resources such as pencils and stationery items to have their our items for use at school and home. It is seeing these happy faces and the recognition that such a simple item can make so much difference.

Lori - a contact of mine - has a brother involved in a tennis club - this has really been such a wonderful resource as we have been able to send tennis balls (used but so much life left in them still) to the kids of Pakistan. It really is the simple things that help so very much in this work.

It is so true that it takes a village to raise a child, and perhaps this is even more apparent in the case of kids in Pakistan. There is so much poverty, but also so much joy and colour - I am very proud of the work we continue to do there and what we have achieved in 5 short years.

### Sri Lanka News

In January of 2021 we decided to introduce DfG feminine hygiene kits to Sri Lanka. The search for committed individuals to serve as DfG Women's Health Ambassadors began immediately afterwards.

Having received every encouragement, quidance and assistance from Carol Mead and the team, the first shipment of 208 kits generously donated by Lismore DfG team was sent to Sri Lanka in May 2021. By this time the pandemic was affecting everything including shipping schedules.

Once the kits finally arrived in Sir Lanka the distribution was severely impacted due to island wide lockdowns and other pandemic-related restrictions.

Our first Women's Health Ambassador in Sri Lanka - Kusum Amarathunga has since managed to distribute 205 kits at four different venues including an orphanage for teenage girls, during November and December against formidable odds.

I am grateful to the wonderful support we received from many DfG teams across Australia. In particular with generous contributions from Lismore, Iluka, Hunter Valley, Portland and Cairns teams, we have over a thousand kits ready for dispatch in the coming months.







## Sri Lanka News

We ran a fundraiser stall on 12 December, to raise money towards shipping costs for shipments planned during early 2022. I am very grateful for the support and commitment of Leonie Kentish and Jenny Pettigrove with the fundraiser.

In addition to restrictions resulting from the pandemic, we have experienced many a challenge throughout the year from finding individuals committed and capable to serve as local Women's Health Ambassadors, shipping issues through to significant customs duties and tariffs imposed on all imports to Sri Lanka.

In the end, it was a case of a great deal of perseverance and patience paying off.

With the many lessons learnt, I look forward to making a positive difference to the lives of disadvantaged girls and women in all parts of the island in 2022.

# **Philippines News**

What's been happening in the Philippines...
I will start with the bad news. The
Philippines was hit by a huge typhoon right
before Christmas, that devastated many
areas, in particular the island province of
Leyte, which was all but completely
destroyed. Many people have been
stranded without water, food or electricity,
we have been providing funds to assist and
Julian and Evelyn, our team on the ground
that look after the dumpsite communities
have travelled to Leyte to put the funds to
use, rebuilding homes and providing
essentials.

Ok, here's some happier news. Jorlyn, from the team has stayed behind to ensure the distribution of kits, clothing and essentials continues in the dumpsites. Seven boxes arrived in the Philippines for the dumpsites at the end of November and all items have already been distributed and several kit seminars have taken place.

There are 12 more boxes currently travelling across the seas to go not only to the dumpsites, but also to Sister Malen (one incredible nun) who runs an orphanage and works with single mothers and young women living in poverty in Manila.

We also have boxes going The Teodoro
Evangelista Memorial High School, a school
for children living in poverty, where
everything is provided. In the next few weeks
every girl currently at the school will have
their own kit, which is a massive
achievement.
